

## EDTC 6030 Portfolio Showcase Assignment Reflective Statement

### **The Project**

This project was a cumulative project that showcased all of the assignments that were completed in EDTC 6030. A website was created using Adobe Dreamweaver to link to the respective assignments. The website had to have integrated web pages, one specific to each assignment, with a navigation menu including a link to the home page, accessible on each web page in the web site. The design of each of the web pages had to have consistent design and formatting in order to help the viewer understand that they were on the same website from page to page.

### **Project Development**
